K-3 Amosite Fiber

The next shipment from Africa of Amosite Fiber is to contain one (1) ton of Grade K-3. We have been advised that it will arrive aboard the "Sue Lykes" at Galveston around the 11th of September. With regard to this shipment, we would like to make the following requests.

That one half (1/2) ton be run to determine and isolate problems in roll up and the attrition mill. A sample of the separated fiber should be clearly identified and sent to: Dr. Alan Hodgson, Cape Asbestos Fiber, Ltd., Iver Lane, Cowley, Uxbridge, Middlesex, England. Please advise us when the material is shipped so that we can provide follow up and get the results as quickly as possible.

One half (1/2) ton should be held in abeyance in anticipation of problems connected with the attrition mill. Dr. H. B. Johnson has information covering other attrition mills. Should problems arise in this area, questions should be directed to him. There is a distinct possibility that a new attrition mill or mills will be required to provide K-3 fiber long enough for our use. This last one half ton would then be used to establish the effect a new mill would have on fiber length.
