

Senate Bill No. 2410

CHAPTER 1432

An act to add Chapter 10.3 (commencing with Section 25910) to Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code, relating to spraying of asbestos.

[Approved by Governor September 26, 1974. Filed with
Secretary of State September 26, 1974.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 2419, Marks. Spraying of asbestos.

Prohibits any person, on or after July 1, 1975, from causing or permitting the spraying of any substance containing more than $\frac{1}{2}$ of 1% asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair; and, on or after July 1, 1976, similarly prohibits the spraying of any substance containing any amount of asbestos.

Exempts cold process cutback asphalt roof coatings from such prohibitions.

Provides that notwithstanding Sec. 2231, Revenue and Taxation Code, there shall be no reimbursement pursuant to that section nor any appropriation made by this act for a specified reason.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Chapter 10.3 (commencing with Section 25910) is added to Division 20 of the Health and Safety Code, to read:

CHAPTER 10.3. SPRAYING OF ASBESTOS

25910. No person, on or after July 1, 1975, shall cause or permit the spraying of any substance containing more than one-half of 1 percent asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair. No person, on or after July 1, 1976, shall cause or permit the spraying of any substance containing any amount of asbestos in or upon a building or other structure during its construction, alteration, or repair.

Cold process cutback asphalt roof coatings shall be exempted from the provisions of this chapter.

25911. Any violation of this chapter shall be a misdemeanor.

SEC. 2. Notwithstanding Section 2231 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, there shall be no reimbursement pursuant to that section nor shall there be any appropriation made by this act because the Legislature recognizes that during any legislative session a variety of changes to laws relating to crimes and infractions may cause both increased and decreased costs to local government.

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
