quitted tonight on the first ballot
by a jury, which for a week has
been trying him on a charge of at-
tacking pretty Mary E. Pettinger,
divorcee of Los Angeles.

In her story told on the witness
stand, the young woman said she
was badly injured in a three-hour
fight for her honor against Lucas,
at his home on November 11 of
last year.

Lucas strongly denied the girl's
story and introduced witnesses to
prove that he was alone in his
home on the night on which the
attack was said to have occurred.

SUBMITS SEWER PLAN

Los Angeles Makes Official Offer to
Venice and Culver City

(LOCAL CORRESPONDENCE)

VENICE, May 18.—The con-
struction of a four-foot redwood
outfall sewer a thousand feet south
of Playa del Rey, which Venice and
Culver City may use without
charge, was the solution of the
Ballona Creek sewer disposal dif-
ficulty which was offered to the city
trustees last night by Councilman
Ralph Griswell, of Los Angeles.

The proposed plan calls for the
erection of a treatment plant cap-
able of caring for the sewage of
Los Angeles, Venice and Culver
City. When this sewer is aban-
doned in favor of the new sewer,
which Los Angeles will install Ven-
ice and Culver City will be allowed
to continue using it free of charge,
in consideration of receiving easements
to city property through the
two cities.

This plan would give Venice an
adequate sewage system for \$10-
000, the cost of making local con-
nections, instead of necessitating
the expenditure of \$250,000, as was
contemplated. Following talks by
