Dear Mr. Kelley:

The Oil, Chemical and Atomic Workers International Union, through its workmens committee at Cwentown plant No. 7, failed to receive a satisfactory answer to grievances 65 c 10, 65 c 11, 65 c 12, 55 c 13, and 65 c 14.

In accordance with step four(4) of the grievance procedure, we are now requesting further discussion of these grievances.

65 c 10 concerns working or requiring employees represented by the union to work in supervisory and/or jobs not within the bargaining unit.

65 c 11 concerns company's failure to post the job vacated by Mr. Jack Warrens termination. The job was filled by Mr. Billy Williamson.

65 c 12 concerns company's failure to allow the senior bidder to go on the maintenance job.

65 c 13 concerns the company requesting and permitting employees in a higher paid classification to work in a lower paid classification at the lower rate of pay.

My schedule is rather full at this time for the following three(3) weeks. I am open and willing to meet with you on November 26, 27, 28, or 29, 1966. I also have open December 3, 4, 5, and 6, 1966.

I would appreciate confirmation of one of the above dates at your earliest convenience. If none of these dates are acceptable please suggest other dates.
