I appreciate your giving time to go over our first annual report and I thank you for troubling yourself to write me your comment.

The item to which you refer on page #14, table #3, under lead poisoning is misleading, although it is a statement of fact. I have communicated with you about one of the seven cases listed there.

These men were employed to clean out a tank which up to that time had been used for storage of tetraethyl gasoline located at a service station. Perhaps we should have a separate classification for tetraethyl lead poisoning and use some other designation other than "garages or service stations". You may have a suggestion to make about such a designation. If so, please let me have it.
