Dear Doctor McCutcheon:-

I am sending you herewith a report of the analytical results obtained on the samples of urine and blood which you provided in the case of [REDACTED] an employee of the Kendall Refining Company of Bradford, Pa.

In accordance with the request of Mr. J. W. Stewart of Kendall Refining Company, I am sending him a copy of this letter and of the analytical results.

You will note, I believe, that these analytical results are well within the limits for normal individuals and they indicate that Mr. [REDACTED] had had no recent significant exposure to lead compounds.

I have gone over the entire record in this case, in so far as it is available to me, and I can see no reason for the belief that this man has suffered in any way from lead intoxication. The history of exposure to lead was not such as to justify the diagnosis of lead poisoning, the clinical picture was not characteristic and the analytical findings are such as certainly to exclude the possibility of lead intoxication.

I trust that this report and opinion will be satisfactory for your purposes, but if there is any further manner in which I can be of service to you, please do not hesitate to call upon me.
