this to Ralph Brown, chairman of the assembly judiciary committee, Brown ordered a full scale inquiry into traffic law enforcement.

Previously, Brown had named Rosenthal chairman of a subcommittee to inquire into traffic law enforcement. That was in December. At that time Brown had in mind a quick review of traffic laws, enforcement, and court procedure. His attention had been called to a few instances where it appeared motor vehicle laws were being used as revenue measures.

But the Rosenthal subcommittee turned in an extensive preliminary report indicating a vast need for real study of the entire motor vehicle law problem.

Among the things, apparent at first glance, which constitute basic problems for study, the committee found, are a determination of whether, or not, present court procedure and methods of handling traffic cases are adversely affecting legal principles and causing disrespect for all law, whether traffic forfeiture as practiced in the traffic courts is sound, whether present law enforcement bears any relationship to accident reduction, and finally whether present motor vehicle laws are geared to modern automobiles and modern highway conditions.

In respect to the latter question the committee indicates traffic laws can be segregated into three basic categories: Criminal statutes designed for the protection of the public; statutes designed primarily for the establishment of civil liability; traffic laws designed for traffic and parking regulation.

It was the feeling that traffic law enforcement by the courts was being poorly handled, a conclusion which prompted the California Judicial Council to commence its study of inferior courts several years ago.

The council, under the leadership of Chief Justice Phil Gibson, discovered however that the inferior court problem was much broader than just traffic enforcement and put that question aside in favor of the more urgent need for court reorganization.
