IMPORTED ZINC 30% LEAD

As per your letter of November 20th, the cost of the above would be 11.7¢ a pound in the formula. Adjusting to Zinc Oxide would, of course, increase this cost and the savings would be impractical.

However, the whole Endurance formula, at one time, contained 35% leaded zinc. Therefore, if a pound for pound substitution was made at the present time with the 30% leaded zinc for the 18% leaded zinc we have in now, taking into account that in recent formulations we have dropped the lead content in Endurance paint appreciably, we would then save possible 1¢ or a little more per gallon in Endurance paint.

Please note that the above is based on 100% substitution for the 18% leaded zinc with this new imported leaded zinc at 30%.

If it was deemed that we do not want to go back to practically the same lead content that we had in several years ago, then we could not do the above.

I do not know whether this is worthwhile bothering with, but in specifications it certainly might be of interest to us. I am mentioning to Bivans and to Heckman so that they can keep it in mind. It might be advisable to have a sample of it sent in. As you know in specifications particularly, we are constantly trying to battle against cost.
