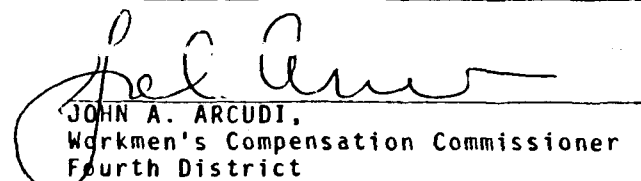

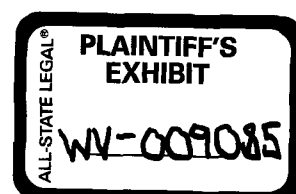

WHEREAS, on or about the 30th day of September, 1938, and for a number of years prior thereto, at intermittent periods, the claimant, John Haydu of Fairfield, Connecticut, was an employee of the Raybestos Company, now Raybestos-Manhattan, Inc. of Bridgeport, Connecticut; and

WHEREAS, the said employee and employer had accepted and were at all times herein mentioned subject to Part B of the Workmen's Compensation Act of the State of Connecticut, as amended, and the employer had insured its liability thereunder for various periods during which the said claimant was employed with the Employers Liability Assurance Corporation, the American Surety Company, the Hartford Accident and Indemnity Company, and The Travelers Insurance Company, all of which said companies exist and do business under the laws of this State and are duly authorized to take such risks in this State and

WHEREAS, the claimant claims that on or about the 30th

day of September, 1938, he suffered an occupational disease, to wit: asbestosis; and further claims that said occupational disease arose out of and in the course of his employment with the said employer; and further claims that said disease is compensable; and further claims that he has been disabled from all work since said September 30, 1938; and further claims that he will be disabled in the future, all of which said claims each and all of said respondents deny; and

WHEREAS, the claimant and respondents are in further dispute as to the actual periods of employment of the said claimant with the said employer; and

WHEREAS, the said claimant and the respondents are in further dispute as to the particular company carrying the compensation insurance during the periods of the said claimant's employment with the said employer; and

WHEREAS, a partial hearing of said claim was held before the Compensation Commissioner for the said Fourth Congressional District as will more fully appear in the files of said office; and

WHEREAS, the said John Haydu has a wife, Anna, and one minor child, to wit:

John Haydu, Jr., both of whom are potential dependents, and

WHEREAS, the said claimant was represented at the aforesaid hearing and is now represented by counsel; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the claimant and the said respondents to reach an amicable adjustment of the above disputed claims to the end further litigation be avoided and doubtful and disputed claims be rendered certain.

THERE IS TO CERTIFY, that I, the claimant, have agreed to receive

From the Employers Liability Assurance Corporation \$12.44

From the American Surety Company \$296.82

From the Hartford Accident and Indemnity Co. \$435.46
From The Travelers Insurance Company \$245.28;
in full accord and satisfaction of above disputed claims.

AND TO FURTHER CERTIFY that in consideration of said sums so paid, I, the claimant, do hereby remise, release and forever discharge the employer and all the insurer respondents from all claims for compensation benefits whether for compensation in any form payable to me under said Act or for surgical, medical or hospital benefits payable on my behalf, and whether said claims have already arisen or hereafter might arise by reason the aforesaid claim for occupational disease.

AND TO FURTHER CERTIFY that I, Anna Haydu, wife of aforesaid claimant, John Haydu, do agree that in consideration of said sums so paid to remise, release and forever discharge each and all the above named respondents from any and all claims which I might hereafter have against any and all of them by reason of the alleged incurring of an occupational disease by the said John Haydu while in the employ of the said employer-respondent.

AND TO FURTHER CERTIFY that I, the claimant, John Haydu, as parent, natural guardian and next friend of aforesaid minor child, potential dependent, and I, Anna Haydu, wife of said John Haydu, potential dependent, and mother of aforesaid minor child, and potential dependent, do, in further consideration of said sums so paid, discharge each and all the above named respondents from all claims which might hereafter be made by them against me, or all or the above named respondents by reason of the aforementioned alleged incurring of an occupational disease by the said John Haydu while in the employ of the above named employer-respondent.

AND TO FURTHER CERTIFY that we, the claimant and the respondents, hereby submit the written agreement to the Comp-

ensation Commissioner of the Fourth Congressional District
and respectfully ask that said agreement may be approved with
the force of a full and final award.
