Dear Dr. Dorr:

I am enclosing herewith report on re-examination of Mr. [REDACTED] together with my fee bill.

I have no further comment to make except to point out that the X-Ray examination which I requested at this time might better have been done at the original examination. I know of nothing more difficult in a diagnostic way than one of these elimination diagnoses. They always leave one with a feeling of dissatisfaction. I therefore felt that in justice to Mr. Hoevenaar we should entirely eliminate the possibility of some serious progressive disease, even though there was nothing in the physical findings to suggest such a condition. I feel much better satisfied with the result of our examination, and I feel that there is little question that this man has suffered from occupational causes. I believe he will show a steady improvement and will be able to return to his work without permanent disability.
