Ex-truck Driver Crowned Champ

TORONTO, Sept. 4 (AP)—Steve Wozniak, a 35-a-week Buffalo, New York, truck driver who said he was "down to his last buck," is the new professional swimming champion.

Wozniak won the title and \$5,150 yesterday by staging a great finish, forging ahead in the eighth mile to win the annual 10-mile Canadian National exhibition swim classic over 53 other starters.

Ben Gazel of Toronto, last year's champion, finished five minutes later to take second place money of \$2,500.

Wozniak's time of four hours, 29 minutes, 18 seconds was 10 minutes slower than the record.
