CALL REPORT

Held a meeting with the Safety Dept., Medical Dept., and foreman of the yard, as previously requested by them for the purposes of discussing health hazards.

Chet Robinson attended the meeting with me and took an active part in the discussion which ensued.

There were about a dozen in attendance and we discussed Fiberglas products in general. Much interest was shown and the meeting lasted for about an hour with informal discussions.

The meeting was valuable if for no other reason than the fact that we straightened them out on some misconceptions regarding materials.

One of the foremen insisted that many complaints were prevalent as a result of application of our pipe covering. I pointed out that we were selling no pipe covering aboard ship. The foreman stated that workers of other trades complained because of the dust and floating fibers resulting. I was insistent that the material in question was not Fiberglas and finally the foreman went to the shop and returned with a sample of material which they had insisted was Fiberglas. It turned out to be Amosite which had caused the trouble.

We had a forum session and a lively discussion ensued for a half-hour.
