I spoke to Mr. Scanlon of your quality control; and, unfortunately, The Beardon Company packaged the Speckling Compound in the wrong style government bag. The bag, of course, does meet GSA specifications but is the wrong bag for this particular article.

We have, today, picked up the material from your Kansas City depot; and, we ask you to consider us packaging the 25# bags inside a tightly fitting corrugated box. We, in turn, would print the article number and all other pertinent information on the outside of these corrugated boxes.

Our bag supplier informs us the government bags suitable for this merchandise would take approximately 8 weeks to be manufactured. The idea above of re-packing the bags in the box would be a one time shot only.

Sorry for the inconvenience we have caused you in our error. Trusting to hear from you one way or the other in the immediate future.
