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first name, your family name, and your husband's last name. Thus, if your name was Susan Jones and you are married to a man named Crane, your towels or sheets will be monogrammed SJC, if letters are of even size. If one letter is larger than the other two, C will be centered, or regarded as the main letter.

Follow individual preference in placing monograms. The usual position on bath towels is to fold the towel lengthwise in thirds and have the monogram in the center near the border. This applies also to washcloths and bathmats. On sheets the center of the monogram should be about eight inches from the center of the top hem.

When you go to the expense of monogramming, be sure you choose good quality towels, sheets or table linens. It is folly to put expensive monograms on linens of uncertain lasting quality.

It is better to choose a monogram of simple, conservative taste than a tricky, odd-shaped affair that you may tire of after the first few months. The monogram should reflect you and your personal taste—then you'll be happy with it, advises Miss Scheuing.
