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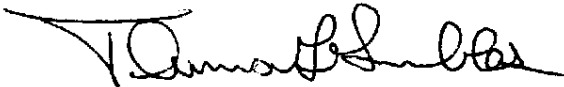

This letter is to update you regarding the status of Vista 47 Ink Solvent under California Proposition 65. This product is not covered by the "Soots, tars, and lubricant base oil..." listing, nor does it contain detectable quantities of the polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons listed by Proposition 65. Detection limits for the listed polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons range from 3.0 ppm to 0.5 ppm. Based on the above, Vista 47 Ink Solvent requires no warnings under California Proposition 65 requirements.
