Dear Dr. Kehoe:

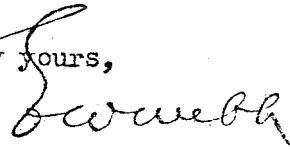
By reference to your file you will observe that on March 16, 1929 we wrote you in regard to a tank wagon driver by the name of [REDACTED] who was working for the Jenney Manufacturing Company of Boston.
