

on Security. His father, Samuel Knight, superintendent of the Wells Fargo banking department in San Francisco, was killed shortly before his son was born in the historically famous "Dr. Nobel's Patent OH" explosion on Montgomery Street in 1866.

Mrs. Knight's father and uncle organized the water service in East Bay and Chabot Observatory was given to the city by Anthony Chabot.

Knight's brothers were Samuel Knight, prominent San Francisco attorney, and Fletcher Knight, of Rochester, N.Y.

He is survived by son Remi Chabot Knight, Shasta County rancher, and his daughter, Mrs. Orta Crosby Hyde, of San Francisco.
