Dear Bob,

To-day I sent you the following telex:

"having serious troubles with getting production licence for Pyrospray
from labour safety council due to asbestos, so visit Walter Czarnecki
has to be postponed, letter follows"

Actually there is tremendous fear for the cancer hazards due to the use of asbestos,
going on in Europe. For this reason we can not get a licence from the official labour
safety council and for the time being I can not judge the possibilities for achieving this.
Discussions are held in the Common Market context to set strict regulations.

How are the chances that Keene's research department can develop Pyrospray without asbestos
and maintaining the fire insulation properties?

We also have to consider now what to do whether we can find another region in Holland that
gives a licence or that we have to cooperate with Siafom or any other company capable to
produce Pyrospray for us without getting entangled in regulations.

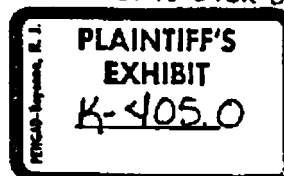
