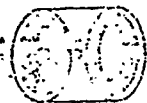


GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. This report is to be forwarded to A/C PIPE PRODUCERS ASSOCIATION (hereinafter referred to as the "Association"). Attention of Executive Director, Suite 1113, Universal Building, North, 1875 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20009 within 45 days following the month for which the report is made.

This report and the information contained in it will be kept confidential by the Association. The data regarding shipments contained in this report will be consolidated with similar data for the same month from other reporting companies. Only the totals for each category will be reported by the Association. No totals will be reported by the Association for any category until such time as at least three companies have reported shipments in such category for a period of three consecutive months.

2. Do not include in your report shipments by your company to other AACPP members. Products shipped by your company to another AACPP member will be reported by that member upon shipment by it.
3. For purposes of this report PRESSURE pipe is defined as ASBESTOS-CEMENT pipe which is in conformance with CLASS 100, 150, and 200 specifications and which is shipped to a final destination within the continental U.S., including Alaska and Hawaii.
4. SHIPMENTS for purposes of this report mean FOOTAGE shipped in thousands of feet.
5. For purposes of this report: (a) Monthly EQUIVALENT TONNAGE means tons equivalent to total footage of 4-inch thru 16-inch pressure pipe shipped to all regions regardless of Class and/or diameter. (b) GROSS AGGREGATE TONNAGE means total monthly tonnage of all domestic A/C pipe shipments.
6. REGIONS for purposes of this report correspond to standard Department of Commerce reporting areas as geographically depicted in FIGURE I.
7. The person at the reporting company to whom questions concerning the report are to be directed by the Association should be designated in the space provided in the lower left-hand corner of the report.

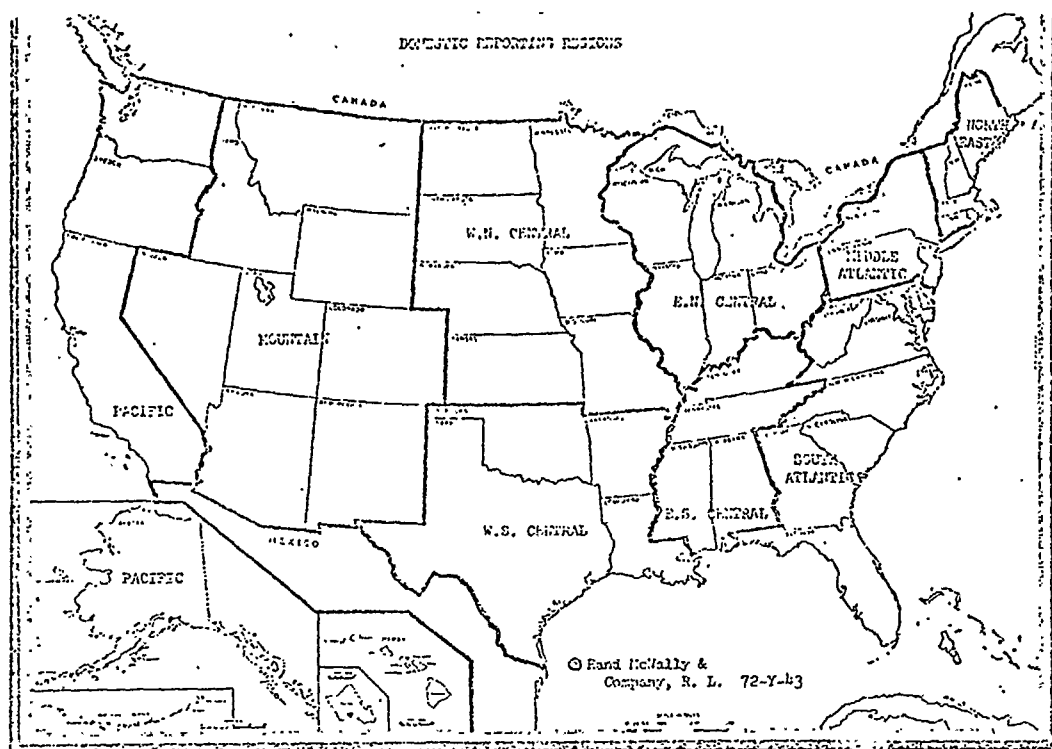

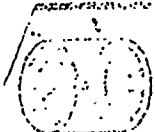

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. This report is prepared quarterly by the A/C Pipe Producers Association (hereinafter referred to as the "Association"), and distributed to eligible member companies on February 15, May 15, August 15 and November 15 for the preceding quarter.
2. This report is not confidential. The information was obtained from the U.S. Department of Commerce Report FT-146 "U.S. Imports for Consumption - TSUSA Commodity by Country of Origin" under Commodity Number 5184100 which is defined as "asbestos-cement pipe, tubes and fittings, in part asbestos and hydraulic cement". Import statistics are compiled by the Bureau of Census from copies of the import entry and warehouse withdrawal forms filed by importers with customs officials.
3. For purposes of this report IMPORTS mean IMPORTS FOR CONSUMPTION which are a combination of entries for immediate consumption and withdrawals from warehouses for consumption. Both government and non-government imports of merchandise from foreign countries into the U.S. Customs territory, which includes the 50 States, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico, are reflected in FT-146.
4. The TONNAGE figures shown were converted from pounds and are rounded off to the nearest ton.
5. For purposes of this report VALUE means C.I.F. IMPORT VALUE and is defined as the value of imports at the first port of entry in the United States. It is based on the purchase price and includes all freight, insurance and other charges (excluding U.S. import duties) incurred in bringing the merchandise from the country of exportation and generally placing it alongside the carrier at the first port of entry in the United States. VALUE is reported in DOLLARS and is rounded off to the nearest thousand dollars.
