New Baldwin Dispensary

Greatly Enlarged Facilities Are Centralized in the General Office Building at Eddystone

AFTER an inspection of the old first aid stations at Eddystone, Mr. Charles E. Brinley, President of The Baldwin Locomotive Works, decided that the Company should have a new, up-to-date dispensary.

A survey had been made of similar facilities in a number of other large industries and, following this, an architect was engaged to draw up complete plans for a dispensary to meet Baldwin's requirements. These called for extensive remodeling of part of one wing on the ground floor of the general office building. Work was started about the first of the year and the new dispensary was opened for business on April 1, 1940.

The entrance leads directly into a waiting room containing equipment for a registration and record clerk and chairs for patients. On one side of this room is a combination women's dispensary and nurse's office which, in addition to office furniture, is equipped with a reclining chair and a hospital cot.

Adjacent to the waiting room, on the other side, is the treatment room which is believed to contain every known piece of modern equipment for the treatment of injuries ordinarily caused by accidents in an industrial plant. This room has an annex containing two hospital beds and a shower bath room.

The fully equipped doctor's office provides a place for cases requiring private examination and treatment. It also includes a small laboratory containing equipment required for blood tests,

urinalysis, etc., and a refrigerator for the proper preservation of antitoxins and other medicines.

Next to the doctor's office is the dental room containing two modern dental chairs, cabinets, sterilizers, and, in fact, everything usually found in a modern dental office.

An x-ray room and a lead-lined dark room for developing x-ray films, complete the suite of rooms. A dental x-ray machine has been installed, and general x-ray equipment will soon be available.

The floors of all these rooms have been covered with a special rubber tile flooring, 1/4-inch thick, in 12-inch blocks. The walls of the waiting room, treatment room and dental room have been lined to a height of eight feet with Formica, which is one-inch thick plywood with a special covering which resists alcohol, acids, iodine and similar sub-

stances. A false ceiling about eight inches below the original ceiling is covered with 1/2-inch Acoustic Celotex which has remarkable sound-absorbing qualities.

The dispensary, at the present time, is in charge of a resident physician, Dr. Julian A. Sterling. Dr. Sterling, however, is acting only in a temporary capacity until the first of August when Dr. William D. Frazier will assume permanent control. Dr. Frazier is on the Staff of the University Hospital in Philadelphia, and the Chester Hospital in Chester.

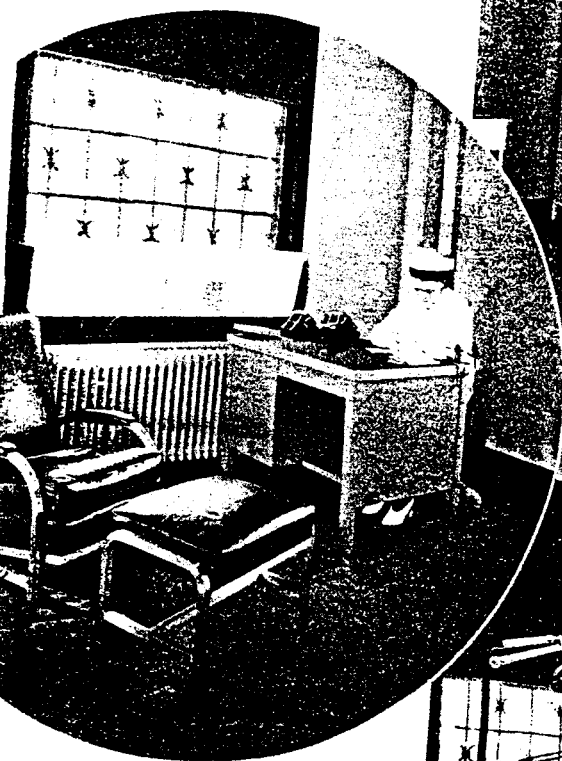
