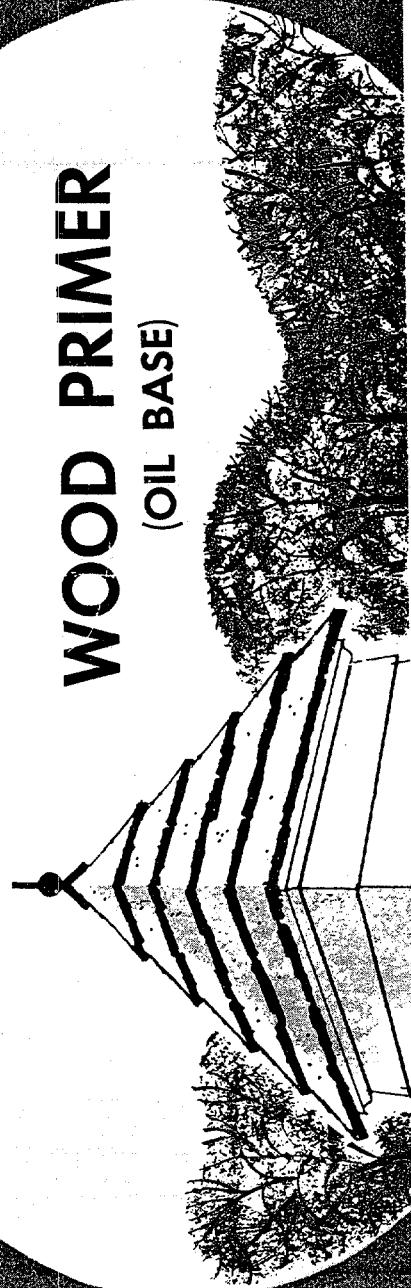

EXTERIOR WOOD PRIMER (Oil Base)

Weather King Wood Primer is an oil base pigmented primer that must be used over new exterior wood, or bare spots in previous coating, before applying Weather King Latex House Paint. Wood Primer improves adhesion and provides a well-sealed, blister-resistant surface that will add years to the life and beauty of Weather King Latex House Paint.

DIRECTIONS

Preparation — Surface must be clean, free of grease, oil, dirt — and dry. Where moisture is present, provide ventilation. Repair flashings and structural defects.

Application — Apply one coat of Weather King Wood Primer at package consistency. Tint toward the finish color with Tone-All Colorant, not to exceed 4 ounces per gallon. Or, tint with Oil Colors.

Allow 48 hours drying before applying Weather King Latex House Paint, per label directions.

CAUTION: New wood that contains water soluble stains, such as redwood and western red cedar, requires two coats of Weather King Wood Primer in order to resist the tendency of the stain to "bleed" through the finish coat. Rough grain lumber must be sanded smooth to assure adequate sealing of the prime coat.

Apply Weather King Wood Primer with a good bristle brush in temperature not less than 60° F. Clean brushes and tools with mineral spirits or turpentine. Stir well before and during use.
