Dear Doctor:

Submitted herewith find a complete abstract in the case of [REDACTED]. Under separate cover we have sent you specimens of his blood and urine. In reviewing the record you will recall that [REDACTED] was in the University of Pennsylvania Hospital under Drs. Grier Miller and Sunderman for a number of weeks. While confined to the U. of P. Hospital Dr. Sunderman submitted specimens to you.

[REDACTED] is still of the opinion that he is suffering from lead poisoning and now that many months have elapsed the study of his case has been reopened. It is for this reason that we are submitting to you additional samples and a complete abstract of his record.
