P. J. Miller, head of the Key System, who directed the clearing of the wreckage, presided at an investigation today into the accident.

"From a preliminary examination it appears to me that both the motorman and conductor violated one of the most important rules in leaving the car unattended on the street," he said. "A full investigation will be conducted before placing responsibility. It is extremely fortunate that no one was hurt."

Patrolman G. W. Wilson and Harold Schulze, who were in the vicinity of the accident at the time, saw the car being run and immediately telephoned for the police ambulance, knowing that a wreck was inevitable and believing that passengers were on the trolley.

DEATH CAR DRIVER IS SENT TO PRISON

SANTA ROSA, Oct. 6.—L. J. Ament, contractor, was sentenced to San Quentin prison for one to two years today by Superior Judge Ross Campbell, following conviction of manslaughter in connection with the death of Ralph Streeter, 19, who lingered for a week with a broken back after being injured by Ament's automobile.

Ament was convicted by a jury on the showing that he was driving recklessly in June, 1923, when his machine struck an auto in which young Streeter was a passenger.

Arrested for reckless driving, the charge was not pressed pending the outcome of the boy's injuries. Geo. Streeter, the boy's father, swore to a manslaughter charge following his death.

Judge Campbell refused Ament's request for a new trial, and notice of an appeal was filed.

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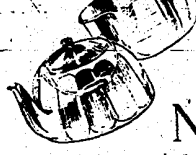
