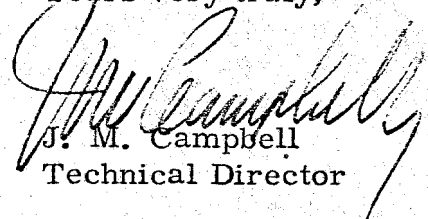
Thank you very much for the memorandum concerning a proposed investigation of lung cancer through exposure to the combustion products of automotive exhaust gases.

With your permission I would like to circulate this to the other members of the Vehicle Combustion Products Subcommittee of the Automobile Manufacturers Association of which I happen to be chairman. Before circulating it to the committee, however, I believe it would be desirable to delete all references to the need for financial support. For example, I would like to delete the last three sentences on page 3 beginning with "The latter is a fairly straightforward problem", etc., and all of Part III starting on page 5. We would not plan to circulate the interim report of the API project.

I think that our discussions of the desirability of making such a study should not be confused with modes of financing the investigation and that if we could get agreement on the principle we can consider the financing separately at a later time.

I would like to circulate this to the committee because I think it is an automobile industry problem rather than a distinctly General Motors problem.
