Dear Ms. Gallagher:

Using transmission electron microscopy and selected area electron diffraction, we have analyzed a sample designated as Sample A. In this material we found extremely platy talc and no asbestiform minerals. We did, however, find some fine inorganic particles which we believe, from their electron diffraction patterns, to be calcium sulfide. This may result from decomposition and sulfidization of dolomite which is a standard procedure in air pollution techniques to trap sulfur from fuels.
