tion and signs along the way  
motorists, "dangerous but pass-  
able" but torn up as the road was  
the Chevrolet knee action smooth-  
ed out every bump, little and big.  
Coming to a deep ravine, which  
is man made, our eye is focused on  
a large steam shovel at the bottom.  
We learn that here a bridge is  
going to be built to eliminate a  
bad turn. This would make an  
ideal picture, so we rig up the  
camera and take "shots" of it.

Once again we travel with the  
steady flow of traffic. Far ahead  
of us the fog is breaking and sun-  
shine is just around the corner.

A steep hill looms up before us,  
but the powerful 8 cylinder valve-  
in-head motor in the Chevrolet  
flattens the road to a mere incline.

### INSPIRING OUTLOOK

The highest point is reached on  
the highway when we turn from  
the main artery and stop on a  
parking area known as Inspiration  
Point. Here we command a view  
of wooded hillsides and valleys far  
below. Across a gulch is the state  
highway jammed with the flow of  
motorists.

From here we descended down  
a winding road and through the  
mountains into Holy City. There  
was no body sway to be felt in the  
Chevrolet when turns appeared  
from nowhere.

Holy City, a "different town,"  
boasts one of the first radio sta-  
tions, KFQU. This town is under  
the guidance of Father William  
Riker, who is supposedly introduc-  
ing a new world of freedom and  
contentment. It is called "a new  
Jew and Gentile world."

Not far outside the city is the  
famous sanitarium, "The Oaks",  
which is beautifully situated  
among the tall trees.

Now the sun was shining in full  
blast, the weather was getting  
warmer. But inside the Chev-  
rolet the Fisher "no-draft" ventila-

ing being closed on Sunday, we  
content ourselves with just view-  
ing its beauty on the exterior.

### MASSIVE STRUCTURE

Located in the community's civic  
center, the building has a 320-foot  
frontage on San Carlos street and  
runs back 280 feet. It is of Span-  
ish design and steel-concrete con-  
struction. Above the front en-  
trance is a 100-foot hexagon tower  
surmounted by a belfry copied  
from the old Missions. Other ar-  
chitectural features include nu-  
merous arches and columns, deep-  
ly-recessed doors and windows to  
create the impression of thick  
adobe walls, balconies decorated  
with large pieces of pottery.

The building cost \$435,000 ex-  
clusive of the site, more than half  
of which was donated by Mr. and  
Mrs. T. S. Montgomery. One third  
of the total cost was met by PWA  
grant, the balance being raised by  
bond issue.

To complete our circuit, we  
head the Chevrolet south on U. S.  
highway No. 101. Here we travel  
with the cool breeze that is ever  
present on the Prunedale highway.  
Our last stop before ending this  
pleasant drive is beside the fam-  
ous rocks on the Prunedale cut-  
off. The sturdiness of these giant  
rocks at once associates them with  
the Chevrolet. Sturdiness is built  
into this car from bumper to  
bumper.

The motorist's mileage was only  
150 miles, but the ease of handling,  
comfort, smoothness and thrill of  
driving the new Chevrolet made  
the trip all too short.

Question: Do traffic regulations  
apply to operators of bicycles?  
T. H.

Answer: Yes. Every person rid-  
ing a bicycle upon a highway in  
California is subject to the pro-  
visions of the vehicle code traffic  
regulations, except those regula-  
tions which by their very nature  
can have no application to bicycle  
riders.

Question: What are my obli-  
gations when my car accidentally  
strikes another automobile in  
which there is no driver?—Mrs.  
G. J.

Answer: The law states: "The  
driver of any vehicle which col-  
lides with any vehicle which is  
unattended shall immediately stop  
and shall then and there either  
locate and notify the operator or  
owner of such vehicle of the name  
and address of the driver and  
owner of the vehicle striking the  
unattended vehicle or shall leave  
in a conspicuous place in the vehicle  
struck a written notice giving  
name and address of driver and of  
the owner of the vehicle doing the  
striking and a statement of the  
circumstances thereof and shall

then either to the sheriff of the  
county wherein the collision oc-  
curred, or to the local headquar-  
ters of the California Highway Pa-  
trol."

Question: Does the law require  
me to use the headlamp dimmer  
of my car when approaching an-  
other automobile?—G. L.

Answer: There is no law to  
compel you to dim your head-  
lamps by tilting the ray down-  
ward when approaching another  
vehicle, but the practice of doing  
so is commendable in that it will  
do much to prevent accidents from  
glaring headlights. The practice  
of dimming headlights rapidly is  
becoming the most popular of  
courtesies of the road and more  
than likely the practice some day  
will become compulsory.

Question: Has Virginia a gaso-  
line tax?—E. R. A.

Answer: Yes, the State of Vir-  
ginia collects five cents a gallon on  
gasoline.

Question: What is the meaning  
of "BE PC" on the registration  
number plate of a motor vehicle?
