Report on Alleged Case
Lead Poisoning
Leonard Refineries Inc.
Alma, Michigan

This week I received a call from Mr. John Pfarr, technical director of Leonard Refineries Inc., concerning a report that one of their gasoline dealer's was very ill. The details are as follows:

Mr. [REDACTED] a dealer of Leonard Refineries Inc. at St. Johns, Michigan, became very ill about three weeks ago. He was taken to a hospital and the Doctor who came into the picture was a Dr. Henthorne of St. Johns, Michigan. It seems that from the information learned from Leonard Refineries he has been bothered with swelling. The Doctor admitted that he did not know what was wrong with the man. However, after learning that he had been associated with the selling of leaded gasoline, pronounced the case one of lead poisoning.

Upon learning of this, Leonard got in touch with me and asked that our Doctor discuss the matter with Dr. Henthorne. Mr. Pfarr had previously told the dealer that there was no possible chance of getting lead poisoning from gasoline. However, they wanted our Doctor to tell the Doctor Henthorne this same story.

I called Dr. Henthorne and gave him the address and telephone number of our Dr. Kehoe at Cincinnati and asked that he call him and discuss the matter with him. Dr. Henthorne seemed very much pleased to get this information and assured me that he would discuss this with our Doctor.

In the meantime I had called Dr. Kehoe relative to another matter in my territory and of course at that time discussed the above case with him and gave him the details by telephone.
