Dear Dr. Kotershall:

In accordance with your letter of September 17th, I am sending to your patient Mr. [REDACTED] one jar and one jug for the collection of samples of excreta. I would appreciate it very much if you would see that he is instructed to collect the samples with extreme care against any contamination. The urine should be collected directly into the gallon jug until it is at least half full. No intermediate container of any kind should be employed and the jug should be kept tightly corked when not in use and in a place which is free from dust. The faecal sample should consist of one evacuation of average normal size. It, too, should be collected directly into the jar which should then be carefully closed so that there is no opportunity for contamination.

I should be very glad if you would let me have the available information on the precise condition of your patient since the recurrence of his symptoms since if there is any further information to be gained, Dr. Schradin would like very much to see him again.
