

ANTI-DUST CAMPAIGN: LECTURE COMPETITION

THE Anti-Dust Campaign Sub-Committee invites entries in a competition to select the best "anti-dust lecture".

Entrants are required to submit details of a lecture on dust prevention, suppression and control which would be suitable for delivery to production personnel who have not previously been exposed to anti-dust propaganda.

The rules are as follows:

1. Each entry submitted must be suitable for a lecture of fifteen minutes' duration.
2. Entries must not be written out in full but must be submitted in summary form. Summaries of lectures should detail only the paragraph headings, the examples, anecdotes or illustrations, together with copies of or notes on the visual aids which would be used in the lecture.
3. Entries must not exceed four (4) foolscap pages in length and must be typed.
4. Entries may be submitted in English or Afrikaans.

6. Closing date for receipt of entries will be 31st July, 1969.
7. The Anti-Dust Campaign Sub-Committee will select the six best entries and the persons submitting these will be required to deliver their lectures in full at one of the meetings of anti-dust lecturers which are held periodically at the Chamber of Mines Research Laboratory, Richmond, Johannesburg. The presentation of the lecture may be in either English or Afrikaans.
8. The award of prizes will be based on the merit rating given these lectures by the anti-dust lecturers present at the meeting.
9. The prize money offered is as follows:
1st, R250; 2nd, R200; 3rd, R150; 4th, R75; 5th, R50; 6th, R25.
10. The Anti-Dust Campaign Sub-Committee reserves the right to reduce the number of prizes in the event that the number or quality of the entries do not merit the award of all the prizes offered.
11. The decisions of the Anti-Dust Campaign Sub-Committee shall be final and binding and no correspondence will be entered into.

STOFBESTRYDINGSVELD TOG: LESINGWEDSTRYD

DIE Onderkomitee insake die Stofbestrydingsveldtog vra inskrywings vir 'n wedstryd wat gehou word om die beste „stofbestrydingslesing" aan te wys.

Inskrywers word versoek om besonderhede van 'n lesing oor stofvoorkoming en -bestryding in te dien wat gehou kan word voor produksiepersoneel wat nie voorheen stofbestrydingspropaganda aangehoor het nie.

Die reëls is soos volg:

1. Elke inskrywing wat voorgelê word, moet geskik wees vir 'n lesing van vyftien minute.
2. Inskrywings moet nie volledig uitgeskryf word nie maar moet in 'n beknopte vorm ingedien word. Opsommings van die lesings moet slegs die paragraafopskrifte, die voorbeelde, en die verhaaltjies of illustrasies aangee, asook afskrifte van of aantekeninge oor die aanskouingsmiddele wat gedurende die lesing gebruik moet word.
3. Inskrywings moet uiterlik vier (4) foliobladsye beslaan en moet getik wees.

9. Die volgende prysgeld word aangebied:

10. Die Onderkomitee insake die Stofbestrydingsveldtog behou hom die reg voor om die getal pryse te verminder as die aantal inskrywings of die gehalte van die inskrywings nie die toekenning van al die uitgeloopte pryse regverdig nie.
11. Die besluit van die Onderkomitee insake die Stofbestrydingsveldtog is beslissend en bindend, en geen briefwisseling sal gevoer word nie.

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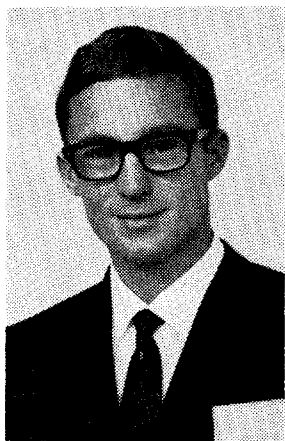

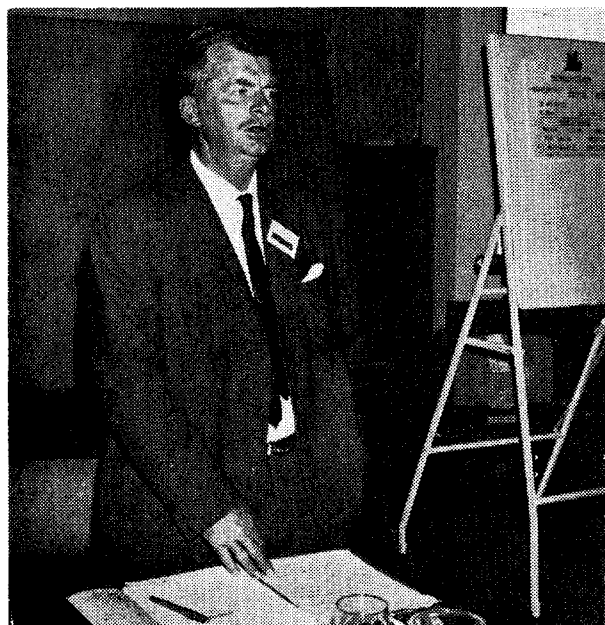

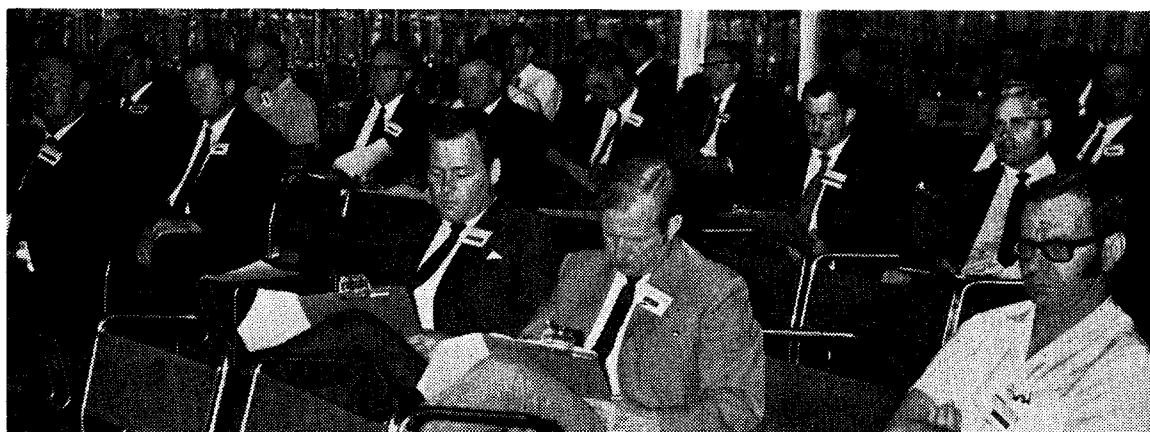

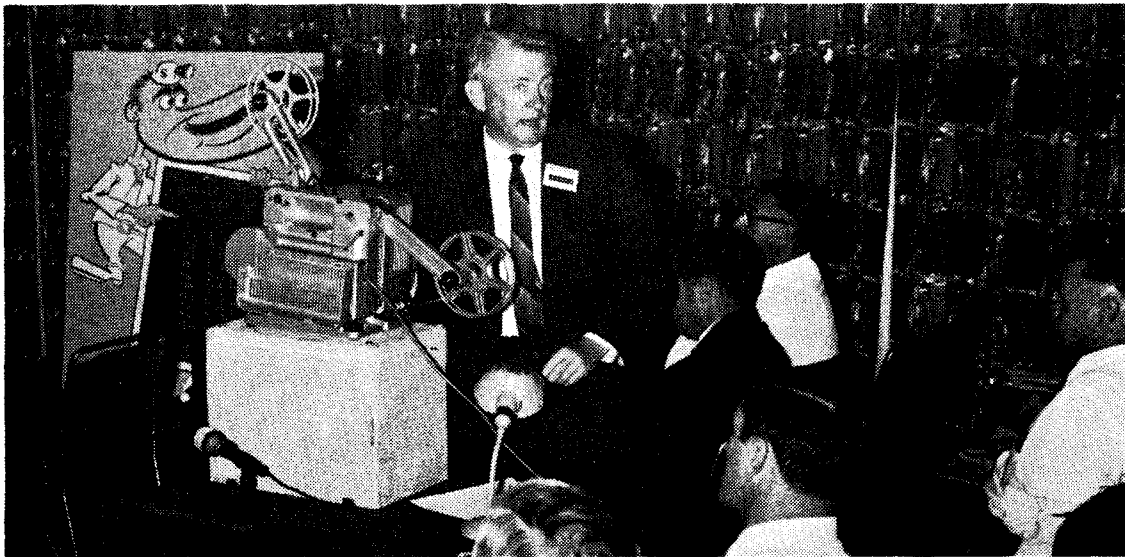
