JONES DENOUNCES SALES TAX DURING CONVENTION TALK

State Senator Herbert C. Jones of San Jose, who yesterday announced his candidacy for the republican nomination as governor, addressed the California State Federation of Labor convention at its afternoon session.

Jones, who did not refer to his gubernatorial aspirations in his convention address, devoted his remarks to a scathing denunciation of the state sales tax and bitterly condemned interests which he said had opposed a state income tax at the last legislature and then, after its passage, had effected its veto by Governor or Ralph.

Sharp Contrasts
Declaring the nation is confronted with a threat of political disintegration, Jones called attention to what he characterized as "the greatest paradox in the history of civilization"—farmers burning corn and wheat while millions starve in the cities; 13,000,000 out of work and 25 or 30 million destitute while a group of 511 individuals enjoy a net income of two millions a year.

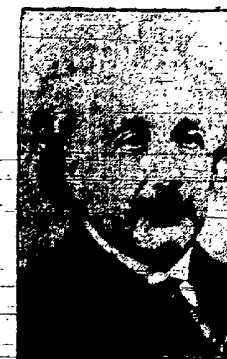
In 1928, Jones added, a group of 809 individuals received an income aggregating 1,300 millions, compared with an aggregate income of 1,100 millions received by the nation's 830,000 school teachers, whose average annual salary was \$1,300, while the individuals referred to averaged \$4,800 a day, equivalent to a teacher's average salary for a period of 34 years.

"The sales tax," he continued, "imposes virtually the same burden on members of each of these groups—it lays a tax on food, equal for the wealthy and for the poverty stricken."

Jones said he offered the amendment prepared by Secretary-Treasurer Paul Scharenberg of the state federation, exempting foodstuffs from the state sales tax, but could muster only seven votes for it out of 40. He opposed a tax as high as 2 1/2 per cent and, he said, he voted against the bill.

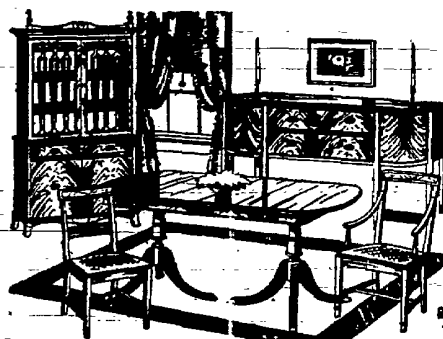
