Look Ahead with Lead

Two recent publications of interest to our members have been received. "Motor Vehicles, Air Pollution, and Health" is a 499-page report to Congress by the United States Public Health Service and is available from the Government Printing Office, Washington, D. C., at \$1.25 per copy. The report contains numerous references to the lead content of the atmosphere and lists the research efforts now being carried out under Federal sponsorship.

"Design Considerations for Indoor Firing Ranges" is published by the Michigan Department of Health, Division of Occupational Health, Lansing 4, Michigan, and is the Summer, 1962 issue of their publication "Occupational Health". There is no charge. Over the past few years, several cases of illness due to lead absorption have been reported in the literature as being caused at indoor pistol firing ranges of police departments. This can undoubtedly be a problem for police departments and even some private gun clubs, so we were pleased to see Michigan's publication which details suggested designs and ventilation criteria for safe indoor pistol practice.
