Dear Dr. Kettering:

Under separate cover I am sending a blood and ~~urine~~ specimen of [REDACTED], an employee of the B.F. Goodrich Chemical Co., Bells Lane, Louisville, Ky.

I did not have any of your containers in which to send the specimens so I borrowed some from an insurance company. They are sterile and do not contain any preservatives.

This man has been sick for about 2 weeks, very ill for about 4 days. He complained of severe pain throughout the chest. The pain in the chest was severe on movement of any portion of the body, but especially upon deep breathing. He was taken care of for several days by another physician who finally gave a diagnosis of lead poisoning. No laboratory test had been made except a chest x-ray.

The B.F. Goodrich Chemical Company has requested an analysis of the lead content of the specimens I am sending by separate cover.
