SDWIS is EPA's database for tracking and receiving drinking water compliance data from states based on the reporting requirements of each rule. However, states may have more update to date data as well as information regarding the use of SDWIS state and the transition from their legacy system.

Right now, I have this: The Environmental Protection Agency's online database lists 88 water system violations at Martin County Water District since 1996. About half of the violations were reported in the last seven years, often for exceeding safe contaminant levels for trihalomethanes and haloacetic acids...
