My dear Mr. Violette:

I have your letter of April 20th addressed to Mr. Webb and relating to one of your employees who is alleged to have slight symptoms of lead poisoning.

I have read with care the correspondence accompanying your letter and am frankly puzzled because I find no reference in the hospital report to lead in any way. Carbon monoxide is mentioned but I cannot see that anyone has made a diagnosis of lead poisoning in this case.

I am referring the correspondence to Dr. Kehoe of the University of Cincinnati and will ask him to advise you on the subject, but, at the moment, I see no reason to suppose that lead has played any part in the symptoms of the man in question.
