Dear Dr. Kehoe:

You recently forwarded a letter to the doctor attending Mr. [REDACTED] Wind Gap, Pennsylvania, who suffered from a skin irritation. Mr. Littlefield feels this case can be closed and reports as follows:

"Mr. [REDACTED] advised that his hands are now completely well and have been for the past two weeks. He has been back to work for this period. Also that he has followed my suggestion and is now using large rubber gloves in order to prevent further skin irritation by contact with gasoline.

"Mrs. [REDACTED] received a letter from Dr. Kehoe who suggested that their Doctor forward him a complete description of the case. Based on this he would decide whether or not it would be necessary for one of his associates to call and examine her son. Mrs. Hoelzel asked her Doctor to do this but she very definitely feels that he has not done it, probably because he is afraid of implications and also the correctness of his diagnosis. Actually the boy's hands are now well."
