We have no comment about the spec itself; however, with all of the various resins, etc., that will be coming to Denison it will be impossible to match the marking on the pipe with the resin or blend combination that the pipe is made of.

For instance, if we are running Daco resin and it is unloaded through the bulk system, mixed in mixer, and put into silos; then along comes a car of Conoco resin unloaded through the system - there is no way of following that car of resin through the system so that we can properly stencil the pipe made from that resin.

This may present a problem in regard to NSF.
