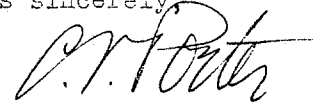
Your air mail letter of the 23rd instant with enclosures reached me day before yesterday afternoon. I am delighted to note from the enclosures that the lead concentration in both blood and urine are within normal limits, thereby indicating that Taylor has eliminated any abnormal quantities of lead that may have been absorbed at an earlier date.
