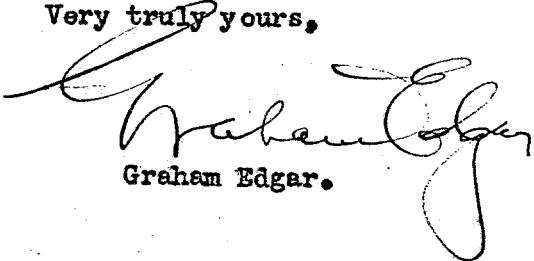

We have a complaint from one of our service station men that he contracted lead poisoning in his hands through the handling of our Koolmotor or Housebrand gasoline. We have never heard of a case similar to it so would like you to advise us if this would be possible and if it is possible can it be determined whether or not if it is a case of lead poisoning caused by Koolmotor gasoline. The man was working for us and did not lose any time so we never made any report assuming, of course, that it was just some other infection. He has been to see various doctors so has had medical care. He went to the Duluth clinic yesterday and we have had no report on their decision.
