My dear Mr. Adams:

I am sending you herewith a check for Thirteen thousand, eight hundred and fifty-eight dollars and eighty-six cents (\$13,858.86) drawn to my order. Will you kindly put this and any further money which I may send you from the same source to the credit of the American Institute of Lead Manufacturers Fund for the Study of Lead Poisoning.

I had asked them to send you the money direct, but since their correspondence has been with me they have sent this first batch of money to me. They have promised us Seventeen thousand dollars (\$17,000) a year for three years for the study of questions of lead poisoning, by whatever methods we wish to adopt, and there will be further money coming in this year as well as later. The amount of the enclosed check, Mr. Garnish, President of the National Lead Company, informs me, is their share of the sum for the year.
