

I have written Dr. Kehoe that the field staff will be glad to cooperate with him and loan his doctors company cars whenever such an arrangement is feasible. I have called his attention, however, to the fact that our men are often scheduled weeks in advance and because of the area of their territory, in many instances, there probably would not be a company car available at the time the doctors called and when this is so that my suggestion would be for the doctors to hire a drive-it-yourself car.

I want you and your men to cooperate to the fullest extent possible with the Medical Department which I know you will be only too glad to do, in loaning them company cars to facilitate their work, but of course it is understood and realized that when this seriously interferes with the work of the field staff that it will not be expected.
