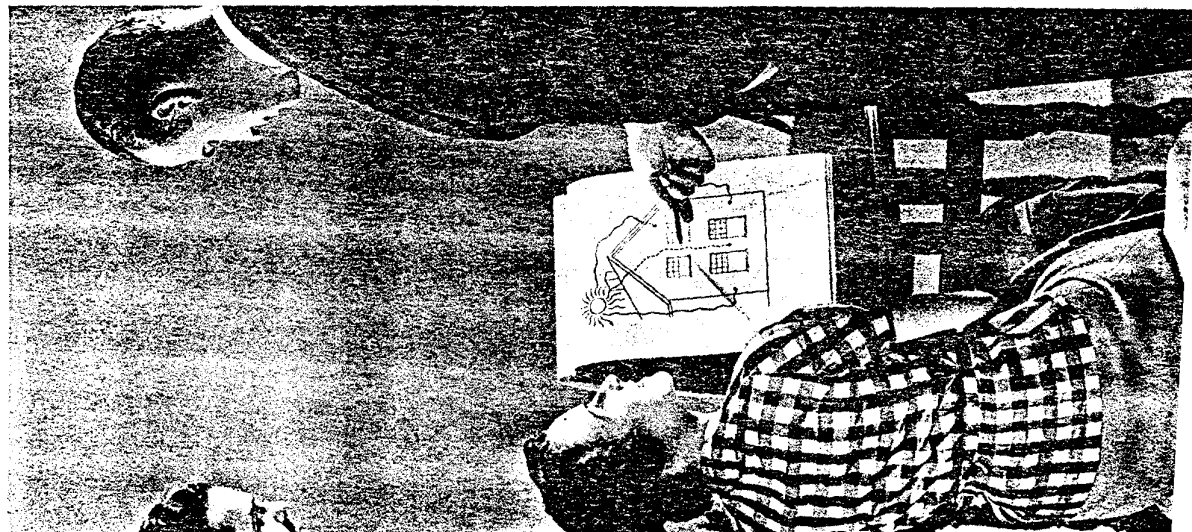




WHAT ARE THE ADVANTAGES OF EAGLE HOME INSULATION?

A flint rock product with no vegetable matter whatever, it offers no inducement to pests of any kind. *Chemically stable and permanent*—it does not break down, disintegrate or settle in service. Eagle Insulation is a *basic* insulating wool which is non-corrosive and permanent. *Lightest weight, lowest conductivity of all fireproof, home insulations*—U. S. Bureau of Standards tests give Eagle Home Insulation a rating of 0.27 conductivity at 103° F mean temperature. This light weight, fireproof, home insulating material in ordinary wall thickness (about 4") allows less heat to pass through it than a solid concrete wall eight feet thick.
