Dear Sir:

In company with Inspector Haslett, I visited the plant of the U. S. Gypsum Co., Foot of Jersey Avenue, Jersey City, and checked up enclosed blue prints showing exhaust systems for the removal of dust.

I find that Photostat P-4825 and J.C. 122P both show layout for machine for sanding and drying roofing material. These layouts are satisfactory and plans have been drawn to meet with the Department's specifications.

Print 84-JC shows exhaust equipment for the removal of dust from hopper and bag filling operation. This plan is also satisfactory.

The systems have already been installed and are now handling the dust in a satisfactory manner. The systems were not handling the dust when Mr. Haslett inspected the system on a previous date, but the fan has been speeded up with the result that this trouble has been overcome.

I would, therefore, recommend the approval of the enclosed plans.

Mr. C. T. Curdys, Plant Engineer, accompanied us during our visit.
