Dear Mr. Nelson -

This is to confirm the agreement arrived at in our conference yesterday with Mr. Richter and Mr. Elliott with reference to the contracts under which National Lead Company has been furnishing E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co., Inc., their requirements of white lead products since February 3, 1938. It is our understanding that those contracts are now to continue in force up to and including June 30, 1944, the terms and conditions to remain as originally written with the exception of certain minor changes noted below.

CONTRACT COVERING WHITE LEAD-IN-OIL IN KECS.

The following paragraphs shall be substituted for those bearing corresponding numbers in the original contract.

1. The white lead-in-oil furnished under this contract shall be the type known as Heavy Paste or that known as Soft Paste, as ordered by Buyer. The pigment content of both pastes shall consist of basic lead carbonate of the same quality as Seller furnishes to its own trade.
- 2-a. TURPENTINE or MINERAL SPIRITS, as specified by Buyer. To be supplied at Buyer's option. If not so supplied, it shall be furnished by Seller and the quantity used in the white lead-in-oil shipped each month shall be separately invoiced at the end of each month at the Seller's net cost for the month of shipment.
4. Seller shall mix and grind the white lead, linseed oil and turpentine (or mineral spirits) in accordance with Buyer's specifications, and shall pack and store the white lead-in-oil for shipment as directed by Buyer. For these services

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Seller shall charge Buyer at the following rates:

F.O.B. Seller's manufacturing plants at Brooklyn, N. Y.,
East Pullman, Ill., or Melrose, Calif., as ordered by
Buyer, freight and/or cartage to be paid by Buyer.

Remittance invoices shall be rendered as of the date of shipment,
and one bill with extensions at the end of each month covering all
deliveries made during that month.

5. Payment of all charges against Buyer hereunder shall be made on or
before the 15th day of the calendar month next following that for
which Seller's invoices are rendered.

6. Fires, strikes, accidents and other causes beyond the control of
either party, while operative, shall relieve the party affected thereby
from buying or selling hereunder, and corresponding quantities may be
cancelled at the option of either upon written notice to the other.

Each delivery shall stand and be treated as a separate sale and if
payment is not made in accordance with the terms of this contract, Seller
to have the option to cancel the undelivered portion thereof. The Buyer
shall reimburse the Seller for all taxes, surcharges or other charges which
the Seller may be required to pay to any Government (national, state or
municipal) upon the sale, production or transportation of the commodities
sold hereunder.

CONTRACT COVERING DRY WHITE LEAD AND CHIMNEY'S LEAD.

The only change is revising Section 5 to read the same as Section 6
in the "White Lead-in-Oil in Bags" contract mentioned above.

Local deliveries of Dupont white lead-in-oil from our Brooklyn Plant
are frequently made by our trucks. It has been our practice to charge cartage
on the gross weight at 12¢ per pound for Greater New York and 13¢ per pound for
Newark. In order to cut down clerical work in your office and ours we suggest

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that from July 1st the rate on all such deliveries be 13¢ per pound on the net weight. That will do away with the necessity of showing gross weights on our monthly invoice and your having to check them.

We trust that all the above is in accordance with your understanding. If so will you kindly approve one of the two copies and return it for our file. The changes will then be put into effect on July 1, 1942. We look forward to a continuation of the association which has been such a pleasant one for us during the past many years.
