Gerard Swope, president of the General Electric company, writes that one word should be added to the formula, making it read: "Analyze, organize, deputize, supervise." Says Mr. Swope: "Before you organize, you ought to analyze and see what the elements of the business are."

To celebrate the 17th anniversary of the Russian revolution that brought in Bolshevism, Moscow will open the first station of an underground railroad that now employs 25,000 men and soon will employ 65,000 men. Several big American cities have talked about a subway system, while Russia has actually built one. How do you explain that? Can it be that there is really something in letting the government run things? Some will hope so, since we all rely so greatly on the success of the NRA.

Idaho and New Mexico repudiate prohibition, making 31 states wet, not one voting dry. ### DIVIDENDS CUT

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 20 (A.P.)—California's largest power company dimmed the lights for its stockholders today. The Pacific Gas and Electric company cut down the voltage on its common stock maintained for 10 years. The company's directors, in cutting quarterly payment to 37 1/2¢ from 50¢, made no statement in explanation of the slash, but the report for the first six months of this year showed net earnings only 57¢ a share for common stock—not enough to cover the 57¢ share in dividends paid in the period.

## German Synagogues Crowded for New Year

BERLIN, Sept. 20 (U.S.)—A record-breaking attendance at German synagogues tonight ushered in Jewish New Year, 5694.

The tremendous expressions of adherence to the faith of fathers came as German Jews, straitened by another anti-Semitic ruling.

The president of the province of Schleswig decreed that henceforth the sacrifice of Isaac must be omitted from public school studies of the Old Testament because of the conception of God expressed therein: "un-German." He announced that further changes are under consideration.
