BONDING POWERS At the same time, the various cities gave up their power to issue bonds, turning over sole bonding authority for the entire area to the Metro Council. This was necessary, Lascelles explained, to make possible coordination of financial outlays for capital projects. It actually has worked to the benefit of all of the small cities, he added, in that each of them now may use the credit of the city of Toronto. This has meant a savings of one per cent in interest costs—which translates into millions of dollars—during
