Dear Mr. Muehleck:

Dr. Gardner happened to be in our offices Wednesday afternoon and I showed him your letter of the 13th. He smilingly suggested that I report to you that I had "brought pressure to bear upon him." I am really about at the end of my rope and don't know what to do other than to keep the matter before him as an item of unfinished business by making occasional inquiries. We cannot actually force him and if we press him too hard we might conceivably find ourselves with a report we would not like.

As you know, I have written him from time to time and on some occasions have been prompted to do so by your bringing the matter up. I think it would do no harm and might help if you would write to him directly from time to time. Perhaps the cumulative effect of mild pressure from several points of the compass may generate enough force to produce the desired result.
