This will confirm the arrangements made by Lou Parente of PG&E and Ms. Juliann Sum of IBEW for skin absorption tests utilizing PCBs supplied by PG&E.

The following information is to be determined by the testing:

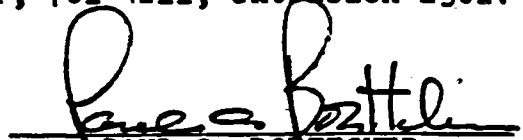
1. Point of exposure at which absorption starts.
2. Rate of absorption - 15 minutes, 30 minutes, 1 hour, 2 hours, 4 hours, 8 hours.
3. Tests to hands, feet, neck, upper chest.
4. Increase or decrease of absorption with time.
5. Cleansing agent best for removal from skin.
6. Same as above with transformer PCB (40% maximum).
