My dear Mr. Crane:

I am enclosing a report of our results of this year. I think they have been singularly successful from the point of view of learning more about calcium metabolism, and therefore of lead, and I hope you will be interested in these results.

I am also enclosing some reprints which were published during the year and would be glad to send you more of them if you so desire, or I will send them to the same list of people that received the lead monograph, if you like. The whole series of papers on calcium metabolism are being prepared for the press and I will also send these to you as they gradually appear. Any suggestions you have to make as to the distribution of these reprints I shall be glad to follow, although we have no vast number of them and there is no use in sending them to people who are not interested.

We have used your generous contribution of five thousand dollars in part for the salaries of one of the physicians and one of the technicians, and the remainder has been used for some of the supplies to carry on the work. Of course the expenses of our laboratory were far in excess of this amount, so that the same amount which you so kindly promised for this coming year is badly needed. I am wondering if it could be sent to Dean David Edsall, at the Harvard Medical School. I would suggest that you note to him that this is your Association's contribution to the Lead Fund for this year.
