15 A I don't think it was ever really being considered
16 as an alternative to asbestos in passenger car and light
17 truck brake linings or anything like that. Sintered metal is
18 what went into the sintered -- semimetallic -- I'm sorry, the
19 cerametallic material that I was talking of earlier. That's
20 sintered metals. Those are powdered metals, coppers, iron
21 powders, lead perhaps, stuff like that.
