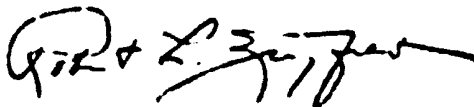

We have just signed a contract with the Armour Research Foundation of the Illinois Institute of Technology for "A Study of Lead-Base Alloys." In this study, new techniques which have been developed in the last few years will be employed in designing a group of alloys to be tested.

The contract calls for a one year research program at a cost of \$20,000. Funds for this project will come from the supplemental appropriation for research of \$103,000, approved at the Board meeting on April 15, 1958, and will be a part of the \$50,000 in that appropriation allotted to metallurgical research. It will be in addition to the \$12,000 program being conducted at the Battelle Memorial Institute about which we notified you on June 6, 1958.

The program was developed and recommended by a subcommittee of the Technical Steering Committee composed of Messrs. J.D. Turnbull of The Consolidated Mining and Smelting Company of Canada, Ltd., and L.L. Barker of the Cerro de Pasco Corp.
